Innovations in Nursing and Sciences for Health (Innovations in Nursing and Health Sciences) is an international quarterly published since 2016 publishing peer-reviewed original articles (experimental and clinical research), demonstrative and case studies in the field of nursing and health sciences. It also publishes letters to the editor, editorials, book reviews, reports and materials from scientific conferences, announcements of planned scientific congresses and conferences. The journal is addressed to a wide range of specialized nursing environment and people associated with health sciences.

The Editorial Board abides by principles embodied in the Declaration of Helsinki and in the Interdisciplinary Principles and Guidelines for the Use of Animals in Research, Testing and Education, and expects any research work involving humans or animals to be approved by the local Ethics Committee.

Procedures applied to ensure the originality of manuscripts in accordance with originality of scientific papers

Our journal applies procedures ensuring the originality of manuscripts in accordance with originality of scientific papers used by our journal; these procedures are compliant with guidelines set forth by the Ministry of Science and Higher Education in the document “Dobre praktyki w procedurach recenzyjnych w nauce” (2011) (Review procedures in science: good practices)

1. Author (s) of the respective article make a declaration pledging that this article has not been submitted to any other editorial office, and has not been published by any other editorial office; moreover, the a/m Author(s) specify the criteria for authorship.
2. All papers received by the Editorial Board are reviewed by two independent reviewers according to the procedure of reviewing.
3. All detected cases of scientific misconduct will be disclosed, including notification about such an occurrence to be sent over to relevant institutions. This implies that the manuscript may undergo an online anti-plagiarism system verification.
4. The articles are checked both in terms of linguistic correctness, and their originality criterion by a native-speaker and by editors.
5. The editors make an assessment of the article, and take the final decision about whether the article may be printed (this decision is based on the criteria developed by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE)).

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All Authors and Reviewers should read and observe the guidelines.

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All the Authors of the manuscript should determine their own intellectual contribution in accordance with established criteria; they should also and approve of the final version of the manuscript.

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Co-workers who do not meet the criteria for authorship, and contributed in any way to the creation of the manuscript should be listed in the Credits and Acknowledgments section.

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
